

She is regional president of ARZA/World Union and also serves on the Executive Committee of the national board of ARZA/World Union and co-chairs the Israel Advocacy Committee. She is also a vice president of American Jewish Committee, Chicago Chapter, where she chairs the "Israel Update" seminar series. In addition, Chaya Gil co-chairs the Israel and International Commission of the Jewish Community Relations Council of the Jewish Federation of Chicago Metropolitan. In 1997, Ms. Gil served as a delegate of ARZA to the World Zionist Congress in Jerusalem. She is a member of the General Zionist Council, the governing body of the World Congress.

The conference brought together over 175 activists from the international community committed to working together to end Israel s occupation of the West Bank, Gaza Strip and East Jerusalem. Cindy has an undergraduate degree from Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri and a Master of Education degree from DePaul University in Chicago, Illinois.

Prayerbook Hebrew is a two year course (basic and advanced level), and this year the advanced level will be taught. The course includes basic Hebrew grammar. Generally, this course is taken before Biblical Hebrew, since it moves slowly through grammatical concepts and since the text is often familiar. If you are new to Hebrew, we recommend studying the books in this order. It is not, however, a prerequisite to take this course before Bilblical Hebrew.

#### **HEBREW LANGUAGE**

Conversational Hebrew is a new class offered this year. Reading skills and knowledge of basic grammar are required. We hope that this class will attract a wide range of ages, and especially provide an opportunity for further study for young adults who have finished their studies at the temple and who might hunger for more.
